Minutes of the January Board Meeting

Tom Karwin called the meeting to order

Members Present: Tom Karwin, Jorge Quinonez, Lidia Hernandez, Karen Valentine, Mary Cross, Sharon Lucchesi, Sarah Martin, Naomi Bloss, Gary Stubblefield

Minutes of November 18, 2018 were approved

Chairpersons' Reports

Treasurer's Report: Lidia Hernandez reported regarding the Christmas expenses, we spent more than last year. Budget for 2018 was based on 2017 but we haven't been monitoring expenses. At our February meeting we will deal with 2019 budget. She has detailed financial information from July on but has not been able to process the whole year because Ruth Pantry kept records for Jan – July.

For plants brought for Christmas auctions, each person was permitted to bring three plants for the silent auction and three for the live auction, but this needs to be monitored more closely. Gary suggested clarifying tags for plants sold at the Christmas Sale. It should be made clear to vendors that if they don't put their names on the tags their plant will be considered a donation. We need people working to clarify that process, and to update the show schedules.

Gary presented a redesign for the show tickets for the live and silent auction. It will be provided to the committee to consider. Tom discussed the need to report to the IRS total gross income from sales, rather than net income. Naomi Bloss mentioned the need to report in-kind income from auction plant donations.

Membership: Karen Valentine reported that 70+ people attended the Christmas program. We now have 133 paid members. The board discussed the need to print a membership directory; action was deferred to next meeting.

Sunshine Committee: Sharon Lucchesi reported there is nothing to report. Ruth Pantry is doing better but is not yet well. She does not want visitors and cannot yet come to the meetings.

Program: Sarah Martin reported that Steve McCabe will present today's program. J D. Wilkert will speak next month on Andromischus. Woody Minnich has sent two possible topics for July; we might schedule him for a second talk. Sarah suggested a fund-raiser for Mojave Desert Conservation. She is seeking someone to make a presentation about that project. Several members suggested additional possible presenters, including Kelly Griffin. Sarah recommended increasing our usual speaker fee of \$150 to \$200 plus travel expenses. The board will consider this change.

CSSA: Jorge Quinonez announced the special hotel rate for the CSSA convention in San Luis Obispo, in July 2019; and recommended that interested persons should reserve their rooms as soon as possible, given limited availability.

Old Business

MBACSS participation in 2019 CSSA Convention: There has been no new information provided as to how our members can assist with this convention. Our members interested in volunteering should contact CSSA directly.

Schedule for Raffle Plant Providers: Jorge reported Peter Beiersdorfer is scheduled to bring raffle plants (because he couldn't come to the meeting Jorge brought the plants). Sarah Martin and Jeff Brooks are scheduled for February.

Stan Verkler brought up other options for doing our monthly raffle, e.g., including four premium plants at the end of the raffle to encourage more ticket sales. It is not necessary for the raffle to break even. We will try the "premium plant" raffle this month on a pilot basis; discussion will continue next month.

New Business

Member Chair: The board appointed Mary Cross and thanked Karen Valentine for her service.

Board Secretary: The board appointed Sharon Lucchesi and thanked Mary Cross for her service.

Spring Sale Chair: This position remains open; Sarah Martin offered to send timely messages to prospective vendors.

Spring Show & Sale: Plans are in progress. Sarah Martin has designed a flyer and postcard mailer.

The meeting was adjourned at 12:05pm

Preview of February's Program

Amazing Andromischus by J.D. Wilkert

J.D. Wikert lives in Lodi, California and works as a fisheries biologist with the US Fish and Wildlife Service. His work emphasizes the restoration of habitat for salmon in California's Central Valley. Previously, he worked in Florida sampling fish and doing lake restoration.

Wikert is a self-trained succulent hobbyist and usually has more than 100 flats of plants in his back and side yards. J.D. has been actively propagating succulent plants for around 15 years and has figured out how to kill most succulent species over that time. He is a member of both the Sacramento and Stockton Cactus and Succulent Societies, and served a two-year term as president for the Stockton Club.

J.D. will provide a broad overview of the genus Adromischus. The presentation will range across information on taxonomy, distribution, cultivation, and propagation, and will include pictures of many of the more readily available species. Be ready to answer when J.D. asks where in the world do you find Adromischus in their natural habitat.

You might have seen J.D. speak in previous meetings about Stapeliads a few years ago. He also has presentations on Aloe, Dudleya, Gasteria, Haworthia, Sedum, Senecio, and a general Succulent Overview.

J.D. will bring plants to sell at the meeting.

February's Mini-Show Plants

Cactus

Ariocarpus, Astrophytum, Aztekium, Discocactus

Ariocarpus is a small genus of succulent, subtropical plants of the family Cactaceae. The name comes from the ancient Greek "aria" (an oak type) and "carpos" (=fruit) because the fruit resembles the acorn form. It comes from limestone hills of Rio Grande in the south of Texas and also the north and the center of Mexico with strong sunshine exposures. Ariocarpus are endangered and quite rare in the wild.

Astrophytum is a genus of six species of cacti, native to North America. These species are sometimes referred to as living rocks, though the term is also used for other genera, particularly Lithops. The generic name is derived from the Greek words "astron" (=star) and "phyton (=plant).

Aztekium This genus contains three species of small globular cactus. Discovered in 1929 by F. Ritter, in Rayones, Nuevo León, Mexico, this genus was thought to be monotypic (with Aztekium ritteri) until a second species (Aztekium hintonii) was discovered by George S. Hinton, in Galeana, Nuevo León in 1991. A further species, Aztekium valdesii, was discovered in 2011 by M.A. Alvarado Vázquez in the Sierra Madre Oriental mountains of Nuevo León.

Discocactus is a genus of tropical cacti. The name comes from the ancient Greek diskos (=disc) because of its shape. Discocactus plants are endemic to southern Brazil, eastern Bolivia, and northern Paraguay. These species are in the risk of extinction in the wild. The plants have a slightly flattened spherical shape. The areoles bear sharp spines. At the apex of the adult plants, there is a wooly cephalium, white or shaded with yellow or grey. The white nocturnal flowers appear on the sides of the cephalium. The fruits are pink or red and contain black seeds.




Succulent

Aloe

Aloe is a genus containing over 500 species of flowering succulent plants. The most widely known species is Aloe vera, or "true aloe", so called because it is cultivated as the source of so-called "aloe vera" for assorted pharmaceutical purposes. Other species, such as Aloe ferox, also are cultivated or harvested from the wild for similar applications.

The APG IV system (2016) places the genus in the family Asphodelaceae, subfamily Asphodeloideae. Within the subfamily it may be placed in the tribe Aloeae. In the past, it has been assigned to the family Aloaceae (now included in the Asphodeloidae) or to a broadly circumscribed family Liliaceae (the lily family). The plant Agave americana, which is sometimes called "American aloe", belongs to the Asparagaceae, a different family.

The genus is native to tropical and southern Africa, Madagascar, Jordan, the Arabian Peninsula, and various islands in the Indian Ocean (Mauritius, Réunion, Comoros, etc.). A few species have also become naturalized in other regions (Mediterranean, India, Australia, North and South America, Hawaiian Islands, etc.)
