Hello Members --


It's September and we are just days away from our first sale in two years. We have more space which means more plants, more pottery, more arrangements and a greater need for

#### Rare Arizona Plant Wins Protection/ Center for Biological Diversity

**Bartram's stonecrop** is a blue-green desert succulent that could be driven extinct by livestock grazing, drought, and the notorious Rosemont Copper Mine outside Tucson, Arizona, home of the Center for Biological Diversity's headquarters. Following the Center's petition and legal action, on Monday the Fish and Wildlife Service finally agreed to protect it under the Endangered Species Act.
