**Notes of Feb 4 presented in lieu of minutes. Mary Cross.** Notes accepted as presented.

**Treasurer's Report: Lou Falek.** Accepted as presented. Discussion about Plant Raffle at General Meetings: members are buying fewer tickets and it is costing the Club money each month. Vote on issue resolution tabled until next Board Meeting.

**Chairpersons' Reports:** 

**Membership: Lyn MacDonald**. Board agreed not to raise membership rates. Lyn is trying to simplify getting membership renewals.

**Sunshine Committee: No report.** 

**Programs: Jorge Quiñonez**. There was a mix-up with raffle plant providers for February meeting. Stan was our speaker and the presentation was well-done and well-received. In March, we will have a Show & Tell, not a Mini-Show. Fred Dotort is our March speaker; he has encyclopedic knowledge and has written a book about succulents.

**New Business, Spring Show**: **All.** Diane is creating ways to advertise the Show. The flyer was translated into Spanish which should also be helpful in attracting customers. We will have more vendors than the fall show, and Peter provided a table request and layout. We will be providing potting classes as a draw on Saturday and Sunday (possibly Saturday @11 and @2 (if two presenters), Sunday at 12 or 1). Pros/cons of having a judged show were discussed; the Board voted for a non-(professionally) judged show; the public will vote. Nancy has set up i-volunteer, and David will assist her if needed. Jorge provided the Board a list of alternative venues and these will be explored for next year. We are looking to clear more money from our shows, by increasing attendance as well as reducing our costs. Members interested in helping explore or having knowledge of possible community venues should please let a Board member know.

For information and comparison of venues:

**Portuguese Hall**, which we currently rent for our shows, costs the Club \$4,600 per show, which includes \$600 for the Friday, since we sell. There are 10,000 square feet of *usable* space, exclusive of stage, restrooms, kitchen, and a large parking lot; all these facilities are important, and used. The Hall provides approx. 70 (6 ft? tables).


