APPROVED MINUTES

October 6, 2024

Call to Order: Mary Cross.

Members present: Mary Cross, Naomi Bloss, Nancy Thomsen, David Kurtz, Jorge Quiñonez, Thomas Karwin, Lou Falek, Lyn MacDonald, Meryl Abramson.

Minutes: Mary/Meryl. October minutes accepted as written.

Treasurer's Report: Lou. Accepted as written.

Chairpersons' Reports:

Membership: Lyn. Two new members attended the General Meeting. Our newest members have been engaged and very helpful in their volunteer efforts at meetings and in support of the Show & Sale. There may be a problem about Square not refunding someone a credit from the Sale.

Programs: Jorge. October speaker was well received, as were his plants and pots. November speaker is J.D. Wichert about Gymnocalycium. Mary will supply the raffle plants. December will be the End-of-Year party. Naomi noted that our Club has shared speaker expenses with San Francisco and San Jose in the past.

CSSA: Jorge. There is currently an auction on E-Bay of Bill Baker's rare and old books. The San Diego conference will be 4/23-27 and Jorge cannot attend due to work. Prior conference talks are available on You-Tube.

Old Business: All. Discussion on how to make the Club more profitable. We were lucky after COVID to have a nice reserve. This has been dwindling over time due to much higher expenses.

Shows: Our highest expenses are venue costs, food, and judges. Discussion ensued about raising vendor rates to 30%, in line with many local clubs. No resolution at this time. Reviews of alternate venues have not come up with a good alternative, and customers are used to the venue at Portuguese Hall.

All Club: Our highest expenses are the winter party and the general meeting rentals. We will be lowering party expenses this year as we will not be hiring a caterer. (Lyn is generously preparing and donating the hot and savory food.) Most of our income comes from winter party auctions (over \$900 last year) and the Shows. Membership contributes *some* income, about \$2300 in 2023 and \$960 this year. Membership rates have not changed in a very, very long time. The Board voted, unanimously, to raise dues by \$10 in 2025. Old dues: \$15/member or \$20/family. New dues: \$25/member or \$30/family.

New Business: All. Mary now has returned Grange keys back to Roger.

End-of-Year Party: Lyn will prepare the hot food. Membership will be asked to bring potluck finger food desserts such as cookies or brownies, for about 10 people each. Jorge will bring water and soft drinks. Mary will prepare hot drinks, perhaps a flavored tea or punch, and coffee. Naomi has punch bowls. Lyn has plates, cups, utensils and napkins. She will also bring the silent auction plates. Mary will handle decorations (table cloths, etc.). She will also contact someone to be in charge of clerks.

There will be three auctions: a live auction, a silent auction, and a plant exchange, like last year. Members are reimbursed for the cost of their plants for the Live auction, and the Club keeps the difference. Bidding for the plant starts at the stated plant price.

Mary will bring a white board and markers so we can note the times the auctions commence and stay on schedule. We also need to better schedule and respect the timing of the food.

Library: David. The Library case is overloaded and top heavy. It is not meant to be moved around and space is limited at the Grange. The case fell over and has some damage.
